

Advance on Japan!

On December 7, 1941, Japanese planes bombed Pearl harbor, Hawaii. Within a few months, Japanese forces had captured two islands off Alaska. In 1942, the U.S. struck back. United States troops, led by the Marines, pushed the Japanese across the Pacific, one island at a time. Two atomic bombs forced the Japanese to surrender on August, 14, 1945.
